That discovery and belief in God comes through a human love relationship for most of us. The most natural place for this experience is in marriage. And this seems to be God's plan.

That the marriage relationship between husband and wife and the spirit of love between them is the living image of God. Marriage is a community of love and is God's plan, or model, for unity among unique human persons.

That the joy and beauty planned for us by God in the Sacrament of Marriage is far beyond our wildest imagination.

That the nature of married love, like all love, is a spiral. If it is real, it cannot be contained, but must be open to the whole world. For it is of the nature of love to reach out beyond oneself.

That you can't give to the world what you don't have. How can anyone attempt to solve the problems of the world, communicate with others, or heal the wounds of an alienated society, if he or she can't communicate with or is alienated from that person he or she has chosen to live with until death?
